Fr. Tomasz writes: I am the vine, you are the branches, says Jesus today. We are deeply rooted in his love. Our risen Lord is the source of all that we need to grow ever closer to his Father and others.

In the first reading, we hear how shortly after his conversion, St Paul was initially treated with fear and disdain by those he had been persecuting. Only Barnabas, who recognized his conversion and trusted him, brought him to the Apostles. Shortly after it became obvious that Paul's zeal for the Lord and his Church was grounded in a very personal encounter with Christ. Knowing that he was loved completely despite all that he had done before, gave him the encouragement to spread the Good News. In the second reading, St John confirms this great work of St Paul when he says: Our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active. And today we all know how active St Paul was and how great is the work he has done.

Another beautiful image of a very personal encounter with Jesus comes from today's gospel. Jesus is the vine and we are his branches. Notice that Jesus doesn't say: I am the stem, you are the branches. Although the branches are dependent on the stem, they are not part of the stem. But branches and the stem are both parts of the vine, the whole vine. It shows that we are not just dependent on Jesus but we are PARTS OF him, members. Through baptism we are put into Christ's Body, not just into an external relationship with him. We are one flesh, one body of Christ. So, our small community in Timperley as a part of Christ's Church is a LIVING ORGANISM, and not an organization. The problem is that so many believers don't see and don't understand this image and its meaning. And what about you, do you understand this picture? Do you feel yourself; Can you see yourself as a part of Christ's life?

This week, let us try to consciously be aware that we are branches of one vine - Jesus, rooted in God's love. Although we may have our differences and shortcomings, we are forever loved completely by a God of compassion, love and forgiveness. Let us pray that like St Paul, we will have the grace to live out this amazing Good News. Have a wonderful week brethren!
