Celebrating John Constable's 60 Years Membership of Brooklands Circle and the Catenian Association

John was presented with a 60 Year Membership Scroll and a Miniature by GB National President Mark Conroy during an After Circle Ladies' Social on Thursday 19th October. A full-house, buffet and 'free bar' contributed to a well deserved celebration of a momentous occasion and a thoroughly enjoyable evening.

John, 1 of 7 children, was born on 25th November 1931 in the Holy Name Parish in Chorlton-on-Medlock. He married Joan on 25th July 1953. They had 7 Children, 6 daughters and 1 son, Chris, who sadly died in a road accident when he was 17 years old. With 7 ladies, his wife and 6 daughters, John had his work cut out! They have 13 Grandchildren ranging in age from 11 to their 40's, 11 Great Grandchildren ranging in age from 3 to 19 years old. Joan & John celebrated their 70th Wedding Anniversary this year.

John and Joan loved travelling and travelled extensively around Europe, Australia and New Zealand, Singapore, Hong Kong, USA, Dubai and even to Mauritius, a little Indian Ocean island nation.

John was a very practical man and loved working with his hands, there was little that he couldn't turn his hand to whether it was plumbing, joinery, carpentry, cabinet making, painting & decorating and wood turning. For example, John made a cot that was used by each of their children, and went on to serve 3 generations and is still being used today. He made a number of life size Christmas Cribs for local parishes, he made the lectern still used in his Parish Church, St John's Church, and all the wooden items on the Circle President's table during Circle meetings with the exception of the lectern.

John joined Brooklands Circle in October 1964. He was always a very active Catenian and held the offices of Circle President: 1975-1976 & 1992-1993 & 1998-1999, Provincial Councillor: 1982-1985 and Provincial Membership Officer 1983 -1985.



As is usual on such occasions a gift is presented to the GB National President's wife who asked for a charitable donation in lieu of a bouquet. Maxine asked for the donation to be given to 'In Sue's Name', a fundraising charity in memory of Sue Blasotta, who died in 2011 from brain tumours aged just 42, leaving two very young children. She was the daughter of Past GB National President David Taylor.
